

## **VULVAR PAIN-URETHRAL PAIN**

### **DEFINITION:**

Condition of unexplained vulvar pain, often associated with other symptoms of urinary complaints, sexual pain, difficulty with activity and wearing clothing. Can be chronic and intermittent.

LOCALIZED VS GENERALIZED

#### **DIFFERENT CAUSES/TYPES:**

Cyclic vulvovagintis	Vulvovaginal Dermatoses
Vulvar Vestibulitis	Hypertonic Levator/Pelvic Floor Disorder
Neuroproliferative Vestibulodynia	Atrophic/hormonal vulvodynia

### **EVALUATION:**

Pelvic exam including pelvic muscles, vaginal cultures, vulvoscopy, Q Tip swab test, lab evaluation for estrogen and testosterone deficiency.

# TREATMENT AIMED AT PRESUMED CAUSE LOCAL/OR TOPICAL:

- -Hormonal- Estrogen, testosterone
- -Inflammation- steroids, anti-fungals
- -Pain/Nerve modulation- lidocaine, gabapentin, baclofen

### **VAGINAL/MUSCLES:**

- -Suppositories for spasm-baclofen, valium
- -Trigger point injections into pelvic muscles for relaxation
- -Botox to pelvic floor
- -Functional stimulation
- -Pelvic Physical Therapy

### **SYSTEMIC:**

- -Hormone replacement with estrogen, testosterone, progesterone, DHEAS
- -Calcium citrate 500 mg 2-3 x daily with meals
- -Low oxalate diet by elimination
- -Nerve pain modulators- gabapentin, amitriptyline, pregabalin

### **SURGICAL:**

-Vestibulectomy

### **PSYCHOSOCIAL:**

- Sexual therapist, psychologist
- Yoga, relaxation
